Lent 2018: *Beloved Is Where We Begin*

It was late October, 2017 and Highland's Worship Ministry Group was at Gethsemane for a day-long retreat. The day away from our busy lives held time to be together, to pray, and to work for this current Lenten season.

We invite you to join in the forty days of the Liturgical Year known as *Lent*—the forty weekdays from Ash Wednesday until Easter, April 1, observed by Christians as a season of fasting and penitence in preparation for Easter. Lent is a season of soul-searching and reflection, originating in the very earliest days of the Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, we imitate Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days.

The poetry and blessings of Jan Richardson found in her book, *Circle of Graces*, will be included in our Sunday morning worship services. Ms. Richardson is also a gift artist and her art will be on our Sunday bulletins. To enrich your Lenten journey, you will receive an email each Sunday evening with the artwork of Ms. Richardson from the morning bulletin, as well as a new poem for your personal reflection. Wednesday Night Adult Programming

Lenten Term: February 28, March 7, March 14

Developing Faith (*Renee Purtlebaugh*): The life of a child is constantly changing and evolving, which means that the parent's life is the same. Renee will explore child development in order to share previews of what is to come on this crazy adventure of raising God's people. What is next—in faith, in life, and beyond?

The Cross & the Lynching Tree (*Dr. Tyler Mayfield*): James Cone will receive the 2018 Grawemeyer Award in April from the University of Louisville and Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary for this work, which unites the first-century cross with the twentieth-century lynching tree. Resident LPTS professor Dr. Tyler Mayfield writes of Cone, "By connecting the suffering of Jesus to the suffering of black men and women, he provokes us to ponder death, terror, and ultimately liberation." In this Lenten season, let us approach the cross through a new lens that might convict, challenge, and change us come Easter morning.

Wholeness in Body and Spirit (*Terry Casey*): Health is more than our physical temperature, movement of joints, and hospital assessments. Dr. G. Scott Morris, the founder of the Church Health Center in Memphis, America's largest faith-based clinic for the uninsured, has written *Health Care You Can Live With* which leads the church to be equipped to care for both the physical and spiritual aspects for our life. New to Highland, Terry Casey is a nurse practitioner who has experience in parish nursing programs, will call us towards a grander vision of wholeness.

Black History Month Display

The Anti-Racism Team and the Youth Community have shared resources and energy to facilitate a Black History Month display in the stone entrance to the building leading up to the Children and Youth spaces. Photographs accompanied by brief biographical information highlight transformative black figures from past history all the way through present day. Highlighted are *Ruby Sales, Recy Taylor, Bree Newsome, Ta-nehisi Coates, Bayard Rustin, and James Baldwin*. Some of these are names you might recognize, but you are encouraged to come view the display to increase your own understanding of black history no matter your level of familiarity. Ruby Sales, for example, is one of just 50 people spotlighted in the new Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture in Washington, D.C. She lives in Atlanta, where she runs the nonprofit, Spirit House Project. Her life and activism are firmly rooted in her deep faith.
