The good news is as epic as it gets, with universal theological implications, and yet the Bible tells it from the perspective of fishermen and farmers, pregnant ladies and squirmy kids. This story about the nature of God and God's relationship to humanity smells like mud and manger hay and tastes like salt and wine.

It is concerned, not simply with questions of eternity, but with paying taxes and filling bellies.

It is the biggest story and the smallest story all at once.
